MODEL PLEDGES ON STRENGTHENING DISASTER LAWS

proposed by the International Federation of Red Cross and Red Crescent Societies (version dated 27 July 2011)

The following model elements are proposed for joint pledges by Governments and National Red Cross and Red Crescent Societies on the disaster laws component of the 31st International Conference of the Red Cross and Red Crescent. These are, of course, only suggestions, and Governments and National Societies are free to develop their own pledges related to these topics (including individual pledges, if they prefer).

As set out in the "Guidelines for Pledging" adopted by the Standing Commission on 22 March 2011, any such pledges should:

- Relate to the objectives and issues addressed by the Conference
- Preferably promote partnerships between participants that involve joint action and shared goals
- O Be action-oriented, measurable and time-bound (objectives to be reached in the period 2012-2015)
- Be reasonably short (maximum 10 lines).

 Collaborate [over the next two years/four years] to [review/assess] domestic laws, procedures and institutional frameworks for international disaster response in light of the Guidelines on the Domestic Facilitation and Regulation of International Disaster Relief and Initial Recovery Assistance, in order to determine whether any elements can be strengthened.

 Collaborate [over the next two years/four years] in the development of [procedures/legislation/regulations] to better facilitate and regulate international disaster assistance [making reference, where relevant, to the Model Act for the Facilitation and Regulation of International Disaster Relief and Initial Recovery Assistance].

3. Addressing regulatory barriers to emergency and transitional shelter

The Government and National Red Cross / Red Crescent Society of _____ pledge to collaborate [over the next two years/four years] to [review/assess] the potential regulatory challenges that might impede rapid and equitable shelter solutions to those displaced by natural disasters in their country and to promote dialogue on practical solutions.
